

2015 Llama Club Fair Schedule

Sunday	July 12	Meeting 4:00-6:30. Finish grooming animals for the fair - completely brushed, nails trimmed. Bring llama posters & wool projects to our meeting to have checked in. All project check in 4:00 - 7:00 at the Extension Office. We have volunteer parents who will deliver llama projects to the fair if you bring posters & wool projects here at the beginning of our meeting. ALSO, 3:00 p.m. Senior's Meeting.
Tuesday	July 14	6:00 p.m. Set Up in the Llama Barn - Pens & Arena Fence, Equipment, move Obstacles. Parent help needed!!!!
Wednesday	July 15	9:00 a.m. Take llamas to the fair and grooming day. Need some youth to sign up to help transport. Groom and shampoo at 11:00 at the fairgrounds.

Friday	July 17	10:00 a.m. Youth Judging Class 1:00 p.m. Walk-A-Llama for the public (lots of pre-school classes attend) 5:00 p.m. Costume Class 6:00 p.m. Lleaping Llama 8:00 p.m. Walk-A-Llama (biggest crowd at the fair – we need you)
Saturday	July 18	8:30 a.m. Showmanship Classes 2:30 p.m. Obstacle Class
Sunday	July 19	1:00 p.m. Walk-A-Llama 2:30 p.m. Parent Llama Show (parents of llama club members)
Monday	July 20	3:00 p.m. Royal Showmanship - Our Senior Showmanship winner will compete in Royal Showmanship and show six different species. A great honor. Our club attends to cheer on our senior representative. Clean Up and Take Animals home about 5:00 p.m.

Although our schedule seems busy, our classes are divided among different days and we will have two judges on our performance courses to allow the classes to finish in a shorter length of time. We will have relaxed time within the barn and to enjoy the Fair. We have tried to schedule our main classes so they don't conflict with other livestock shows.

Animals should be groomed well before the fair so a shampoo on Wednesday will ready them for the Fair. If you have brushed out your animal well early on in the season as required, this will not be a problem on Shampoo Day.

A Club Fair Schedule of group duties will be set up in 2 hour time periods so all llamas will be cared for all days. You will not need to worry about care for your animal except at your assigned times. There will be assigned morning chores to take care of the animals and also assigned night time chores to prepare them for the night. A club schedule will be handed out prior to the Fair and there will be a Day Chair for each day to check-in with. If everyone does their assigned times, each club member will have an easier fair and the animals will be well cared for.

Walk-A-Llama is an event that we offer to the public. We receive donations which goes into our barn fund. The busiest Walk-A-Llama time is on Friday night.

Lleaping Llama and Llama Limbo are fun classes for the club and also entertain the public. We usually get large crowds who get caught up in the fun. Some of these times may be altered somewhat if time does not permit or weather is too hot.

The Parent Show is an annual event within our Club. The club members teach one parent how to do Showmanship and Obstacle to compete. Due to the expertise of some, we now have a Novice and Masters Class. Ribbons are awarded!

Classes are divided according to age (Beg., Int., Sr.) and then are further divided into the ability of the animals. (Novice & Masters) This allows smaller age divisions and more ribbon placings. We try to accommodate everyone and their skills. Grand & Reserve Champions receive very nice plaques.

Donations are welcomed for the fair plaques and very helpful. If you do donate, please specify the llama club so they know our group is participating in these donations.

As always, we will have a Sign-In/Sign-Out Sheet for our club members in the Llama Barn. Our policy is to never leave the llama barn (even with parents) without letting us know and always go with a buddy - whether it be to eat (even with your parents), a restroom break, or to see the fair. Our club members hang out a lot in our llama barn and often enjoy games and "kick-back" time together.
